Vegan Mushroom Lentil Loaf with Cranberries

1 small finely chopped onion

2 garlic cloves finely chopped

1 cup cooked red lentils

1 cup cooked green lentils

3 cups finely chopped mushrooms

1/2 cup walnuts pieces

8 tbsps ground flax seed

1/2 cup all purpose flour or oat spelt

1 cup packed breadcrumbs

1/2 cup dried cranberries

1/2 cup large apple, grated

1 tsp salt

1 tsp pepper

1 tsp dried sage

1 tsp dried thyme

1 tsp dried rosemary

1 tsp tamari or soy sauce

Add all of the ingredients in a large bowl and use your hands to scrunch It together.

Cranberry Toppings

What is the list of ingredients for making the flu vaccination?

Information about the flu vaccination can be found at <u>CDC.gov</u>. The list of ingredients for making the flu vaccine for humans is interesting. Ingredients include sugar or gelatin, aluminum salts, formaldehyde, residual cell culture materials (example: egg protein), common residual antibiotics (penicillin is not used because more people are likely to be allergic to it), and preservatives (found in some kinds of fish). There is a flu vaccine for people who are allergic to eggs. These people need to go to their healthcare facility to receive the vaccine so their reaction to the vaccine can be monitored.

Each ingredient has its own role in increasing the potency of the flu vaccine. Stabilizers, such as sugar, help to keep the vaccine effective after manufacturing. Adjuvants, such as aluminum salts, help to boost the body's absorbency of the vaccine. Residual inactivating ingredients, such as formaldehyde, kill the virus or inactivate toxins during the manufacturing process. Residual cell culture materials, like egg protein, produce enough virus or bacteria to make the vaccine. Common antibiotics (for example, neomycin, kanamycin, streptomycin, but not penicillin) are used to prevent contamination by bacteria during the manufacturing process. Preservatives, found in some fish, prevent contamination. One example is thimerosal, which is used only in multidose flu vaccines. It has a form of mercury (ethylmercury) in it, but does not cause mercury poisoning and is safe to use in vaccines. https:// www.cdc.gov/vaccines/vac-gen/additives.htm.

John S. and Betty J. Schuchman Deaf Documentary Center, named in their honor. They endowed a Deaf History Award that recognizes excellence in documenting the lives of deaf people.
