He said that this link provided a pretty good summary. He knows that this is an advertisement, but feels comfortable recommending everyone to buy one or two. Keep them where they are easily accessible.

One important point — Both fire blankets and fire extinguishers are to be stored in the direction of an exit location. If there is a fire, you can go to where they are stored. Look at the fire and make the final decision — is it small enough that you can put it out? Is it so big that you and everyone else need to evacuate and call 911?

#### Louis Comfort Tiffany: The Painter

Louis Comfort Tiffany (1848-1933) originally trained as a painter. He studied in the United States under George Innes, a highly regarded landscape painter, and Samuel Colman, a famous landscape watercolorist. Additionally, Tiffany studied under Léon Charles Adrien Bailly in Paris. Bailly was known for his genre painting, portraits, and historical subjects. Tiffany was also influenced by the work of French painter Léon Adolphe Auguste Belly who specialized in Orientalis landscapes and Islamic genre scenes. Tiffany traveled in North America and Europe. He painted many canvases inspired by his travels. After visiting North Africa, he began incorporating exotic themes and architecture in his work. His aintings also reflected his keen interest in color and light. French Impressionism fluenced his later paintings. Tiffany exhibited locally in New York City starting in 867 before also displaying his work at international exhibitions, such as the hiladelphia Centennial Exhibition of 1876 and the Columbian Exposition of 1893 Chicago. However, by the mid-1890s, Tiffany was spending most of his time in e decorative arts, although he never gave up painting. His work in this medium vered an astonishing variety of subjects, including still life, genre, landscape, re painting, architecture, animal painting, and travel sketches. His later ures were rarely shown outside his own homes.
