






What: A 196 Days Voyage around the world Date of this report: Saturday, May 11, 2024

Current Location: Khasab, Oman on the Oceania Insignia Ship

Heading To: Dubai, United Arab Emirates

For the past 5 weeks, we have been experiencing high temperatures (89 to 104 F) plus humidity (50% to 80%) as we cruised between the Equator and the Tropic of Cancer. It will be another 3 weeks before we reach the Tropic of Capricorn with the expectation of cooler weather.





Mostly Direct Sunlight the past five weeks and the next three weeks on this cruise!! For us, we will have a very long summer season of 2024, that began in March!

The Grand Palace at Bangkok is made up of numerous buildings, halls, pavilions set around with open lawns, gardens and courtyards. Its asymmetry and eclectic styles are due to its organic development, with additions and rebuilding being made by successive reigning kings over 200 years of history. Since 1925, the Royal Family has resided at the Dusit Palace, 5 km away, and is not open to the public.

Eight royal barges are housed at this Royal Barge Museum which are used for processional ceremonial parades. The other 44 boats are stored elsewhere in Bangkok.

Approximately 300,000 visitors each day at the Jewel Chiang, next door to the International airport at Singapore. It is a complex of shops, restaurants, and indoor park that has the world's tallest indoor waterfall.



The 56th floor at the Skypark Observation Deck at the Marina Bay Sands has a grand scenic bird's eye view of the city of Singapore.





Friends Lim and Poh joined us for a steamboat lunch - wonderful having all four of us together !! This was a very unique lunch, new for us! There were two circular boiling pots on the table all set up with a divider: plain water and chicken broth. We ordered Chicken Power lunch

set, that included the meat, variety of raw veg, tofu, chicken minced dumplings, vermicelli glass noodles, and leafy vegetable Tang-Oh (also known as Chrysanthemum Greens)!! Delicious!!!!

At Singapore, there are two indoor domed shaped greenhouses, known as the Gardens by the Bay. One is the Flower Dome and the other is Cloud Forest. They are the largest greenhouses in the world. The Flower Dome replicates a cool-dry Mediterranean climate with changing display, flower field and other gardens every 3 to 4 months. The Cloud Forest features an indoor waterfall with cool moist conditions found in tropical mountain regions.



Watched the light show, coordinated with music, at Supertree Grove in Singapore at sunset. These supertrees dominate the Gardens at the Bay's landscape with heights between 82 ft and 160 ft.



At the Chinese Clan Khoi Kongsi in Penang, Malaysia, this temple Leong San Tong is the most pivotal building. It is well known worldwide for its extensive lineage that can be traced back 650 years. This temple is highly ornamented, perhaps the most majestic elaborate structure in South East Asia.



Kadri Manjunath Temple with a pyramid-shaped roof on the hills of Kadri (near Mangalore, India) is said to be built approximately in the year of 1068. The square Hindu temple built with nine water tanks was converted to a complete stone structure during the 14th century.

Truly felt inspired witnessing the paintings of Brother Anthony Moscheni of Italy at the St. Aloysius College Chapel in Mangalore, India. A must visit for everyone!! It is said that his paintings are comparable with the Sistine chapel in Rome. His paintings virtually cover every inch of the interior roof and walls.

Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception Church at Goa, India is a colonial Portuguese Baroque style church, first built in 1541 as a chapel on a hill side overlooking the city of Panjim. It was eventually replaced by a larger church in the 1600s as part of Portuguese Goa's religious expansion.



Basilica of Bom Jesus, a Catholic basilica, and its monastery is a pilgrimage centre and recognized by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site. The basilica is located in Old Goa, the former capital of Portuguese India.



The Shri Manguesh Hindu Temple at Ponda, Goa, India.

Mumbai's ferry dock is on the other side of this historic landmark, Gateway of India, built by the British in prep for the coronation of George V as Emperor of India.
