

At a young age, he was immersed in an environment where sign language was widely used.

Darren has genetic hearing loss, and is a BTE hearing aid user. He is involved with ASL and the Deaf Community by participating in many Deaf events. He is the Organizer of the Meetup ASL Bridge/DMV.

Darren's first job was as a professional ballroom dancer and teacher. He transitioned into real estate, earning his license and owning a real estate business for the past 23 years. He is also a professional actor. He performed in Deaf/Hearing productions that bridge communication between communities. He holds degrees from George Mason University and George Washington University.

Deaf Way October 16-29, 2025




Gallaudet University is bringing back Deaf Way. This time it will have a new twist. Starting in 2025, Deaf Way Festival will have the original artistic and cultural gathering concept but reformatting it into a series of festivals with specific tracks on a bi-annual basis.

The first event in October 2025 will be a film festival. This aims to create a space where deaf filmmakers and deaf professionals can participate. The weekend of films will showcase the work of Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing creatives and celebrate Deaf culture, sign language, and Deaf pride. This festival will also include panels and workshops.

Future events will include a Science Festival, Visual and Performing Arts Festival, and DeafBlind Festival. Each festival will have different partners and collaborators who are experts in their field.

Are you registered to vote? Eight states purge voters for inactive voting: Ohio, Georgia, Florida, Indiana, Arizona, Texas, Nevada, and Wisconsin. Voters are removed from the rolls if they are deemed "inactive," often due to failing to vote in consecutive elections. Even though Virginia is not one of the 8 states, it is a good idea to check your Voter Registration status.
