After lunch, the DSA attendees will share their experiences at the conference during August 1-7. In addition, we will share what we did during our "Summer Vacation."









NVRC Hosts Screening of "Deaf President Now"

























Lunula is the only visible part of a larger structure known as nail matrix. It is one of the four major parts of fingernail which contains nerves, blood vessels, and lymph. Nails grow from the nail matrix and lunula where new protein cells create multiple layers of keratin, the same protein that makes up hair. The typical nail has about 196 layers of keratin cells.





NTID's Next President



Caroline M. Solomon has been named president of RIT's National Technical Institute for the Deaf and vice president of RIT. She will start on August 18. She will be the first woman to lead the college in its nearly 60-year history.

Solomon is currently Dean of the Faculty at Gallaudet University. She earned a doctorate in marine, environmental and estuarine sciences from University of Maryland. A renowned scientist and researcher, Solomon has devoted herself to encouraging and nurturing deaf and hard-of-hearing students in STEM fields.



She was inducted into the Deaflympics Hall of Fame in 2020 (a past participant in the Deaflympics as a swimmer).


NVRC Booth during Resident Services Fair on 07-17-2025 at Ashby Ponds




