

# CPR and AED Workshop 05-03-2025

#### Most important actions in the Chain of Survival:

- 1. Make sure the scene is safe.
- 2. Tap and shout. If no reactions, he is unresponsive.
- 3. Shout for help. Have someone call 9-1-1, and get AED if available.
- 4. Check for breathing for at least 5 seconds, but no more than 10. If not breathing normally, he needs CPR.
- 5. If breathing normally but unresponsive, roll the person to the side. That will keep the airway open.
- 6. Give compressions. Push hard and fast in the center of the chest. This is called Hands-Only CPR.

## Visiting Lantz Mills on Mother's Day 05-12-2025

On Mother's Day, Cheri and Pat Hunter took Eve Christian to Lantz Mills, located in Shenandoah County. It was home to a significant number of Deaf residents in the 1760s. By 1880, there were at least 52 identified Deaf residents within a five-mile radius of Lantz Mills. In 1877, William Christian founded Christian & Sons, which specialized in cabinetmaking and coffin production.



## "Scraposaurs"

### Museum of the Shenandoah Valley



The outdoor exhibition at the Museum of the Shenandoah Valley (MSV) features 14 dinosaurs and prehistoric animals made entirely from scrap metal and found objects. The artist is Dale Lewis from Minnesota.

The exhibition includes an 18-foot-long stegosaurus named Stanley; an 1,800-pound T-Rex with ribs and teeth from a John Deere rotary hoe; and a woolly rhino covered in 60,000 pounds of tie wire "hair." Each sculpture blends art and history in a fun and imaginative way.

"Scraposaurs" opened on April 1, and will be on view in the MSV gardens until October 19, 2025. The hours are 10:00AM till 5:00PM. Exhibition fees are: \$15, \$10 Senior Citizens at age 60+, \$10 ages 13-18, \$5 for ages 5-12, free for up to age 4. The address is: 901 Amherst Street, Winchester VA 22601.

## PROJECTED BASELINE TO HIGHER END BUDGET: \$230,000 to \$400,000

#### OUTDOOR PAVILION AND GATHERING SPACE

This project involves the construction of a 1,731 square foot building designed as a versatile gathering space for campers, staff, and parents. The pavilion will hold approximately 150 people and provide shelter from sun and rain, making it ideal for outdoor activities such as cookouts, games, meetings, and events, particularly during Parents Night at the end of children/youth programs.

The building will include the necessary electrical systems to support lighting, outlets, and other needs, though no plumbing is included in the design.

- 2. Pavilion (to accommodate large gatherings)

Did you know that health care providers must ensure effective communication with Deaf, Hard of Hearing, and other patients with disabilities? This session will break down how the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) applies in healthcare settings, from hospitals to telehealth - and what your rights and responsibilities are.

- What "effective communication" means under the ADA
- Why qualified interpreters and CART services matter
- What healthcare provider must not do:
  - Refuse service based on a communication need
  - Charge for auxiliary aids
  - Require you to bring your own interpreter
