HH Monthly Meeting on 02-05-25 Chili Recipes

Dad's Delicious Easy Vegan Chili Recipe

- submitted by Eddy Drawdy -

Ingredients:

- * 1 large yellow onion, chopped
- * 4 garlic gloves, diced
- * 1 (15-oz) can Red Kidney Beans
- * 1 (15-oz) can Black Beans
- * 1 (15-oz) can Pinto Beans
- * 2 (15-oz) cans Diced Tomatoes
- * 1 (4-oz) can Diced Green Chilies
- * 1 (10-16 oz) bags Frozen Corn Kernels
- * 2 tablespoons Chili Powder
- * 1 teaspoon Cajun Seasoning
- * 1 Dash Ginger
- * Salt
- * Cayenne Powder

Directions:

- * In a large pot, saute onion in vegetable oil until almost clear.
- * Add garlic and sauté for 30 seconds.
- * Add all cans of beans, tomatoes, and chilies, with their juices, to the pot.
- * Add corn & spices to the pot. Stir well. Simmer on low for 15-20 minutes.
- * Add spices to taste.
- * Enjoy with corn tortillas or over a bed of brown rice.

Original Chili

- submitted by Melanie Williams -

Ingredients:

- * 1 pkg. McCormick Seasoning Mix
- * 1 lb. lean ground beef or turkey
- * 1 can (14 1/2 oz) diced tomatoes, undrained or 2 cans (8 oz each) tomato sauce
- * 1 can (15 to 16 oz) kidney or pinto beans, undrained



Assorted Toppings: shredded cheese, chopped onions, or sour cream

Directions:

- * Brown meat in large skillet on medium-high heat. Drain fat.
- * Stir in Seasoning Mix, tomatoes and beans. Bring to boil. Cover. Reduce heat and simmer 10 minutes, stirring occasionally. Serve with toppings, if desired.

Turkey Chili

- submitted by Peggy Daniels -

Ingredients for the Chili:

- * 2 tablespoons olive oil
- * 2 onions (chopped)
- * 2 large red bell peppers (stemmed, seeded, and chopped)
- * 3 cloves garlic (minced)
- * 1 tablespoon dried oregano
- * 1 teaspoon dried basil
- * 1 tablespoon chili powder
- * 2 teaspoons ground cumin
- * 3 pounds ground turkey or chicken and/or fresh turkey sausage removed from the casing
- * 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- * 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- * 3 cans (28 ounces) crushed tomatoes
- * 2 teaspoons chipotle chiles in adobo sauce
- * 3 cans (about 15.5 ounces) cannellini, kidney, or black beans (or a mixture of 2 or 3 kinds of beans; rinsed and drained)
- * 2 tablespoons minced fresh dill or parsley (optional)
- * Hot cooked rice (for serving)

Directions:

- * Heat the olive oil in a large deep pot over medium-high heat. Add the onions, bell peppers and cook until softened, about 4 minutes. Add the garlic, oregano, basil, chili powder, and cumin, and cook for 2 minutes more.
- * Add the turkey, chicken, sausage, or whatever combination you are using, and the salt and black pepper, stirring to coat well with all of the spices. Cook, stirring, until the meat loses its pinkness, about 6 minutes, then add the tomatoes, chipotles, if using, and the beans. Reduce the heat to medium and cook, stirring occasionally, until the mixture tastes like chili, 25 to 30 minutes. Stir in the dill or parsley, if using, and add more salt and/or pepper as necessary.
- * Serve the chili with hot rice and any toppings you like.
