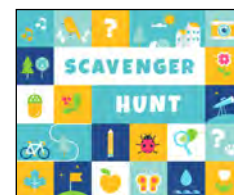

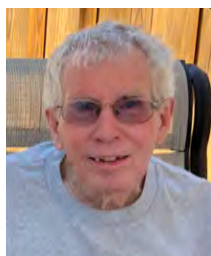

How to Survive a Heart Attack Alone

At the HH Social Chat on August 27, Cyril Potosky gave the attendees tips on how to survive a heart attack. If you are alone and believe you are having a heart attack, here are two links for what to do:

1. Stop what you are doing.
2. Call 911 or your local emergency number right away.
3. Consider contacting someone to come over immediately.
4. Unlock your door, after calling for help.
5. Chew on aspirin (if available).
6. Avoid driving.
7. Stay calm.
8. Lie down.
9. Take deep, steady breaths of fresh air.
10. Do not attempt cough CPR
11. Avoid food and drink.
12. Follow up with your doctor.

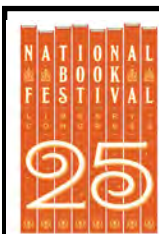


How to play Chronology

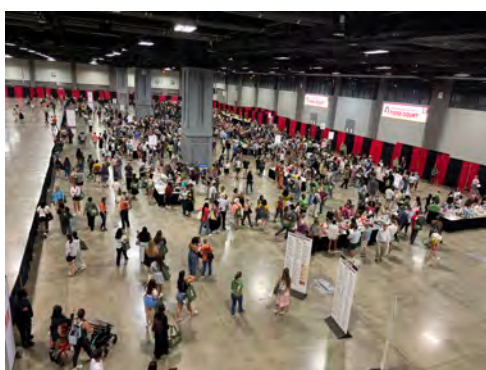
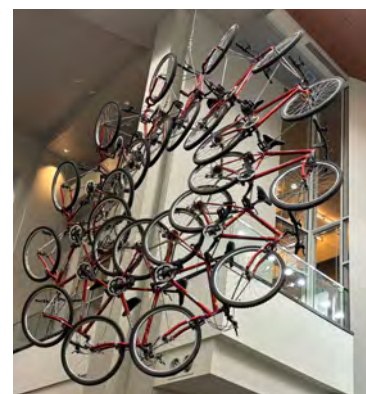
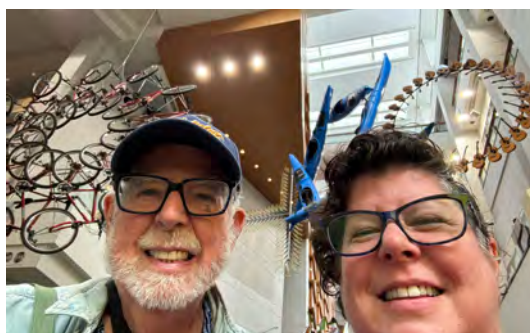
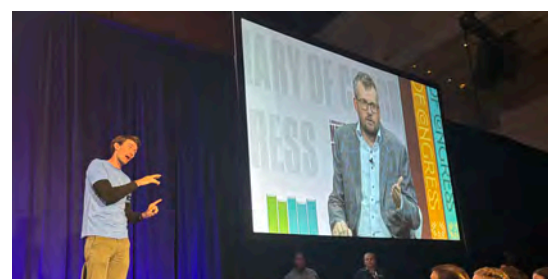
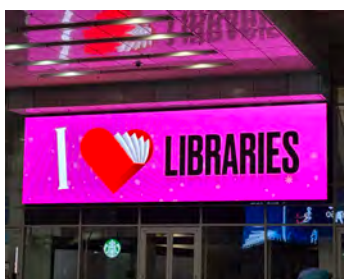


Library of Congress National Book Festival

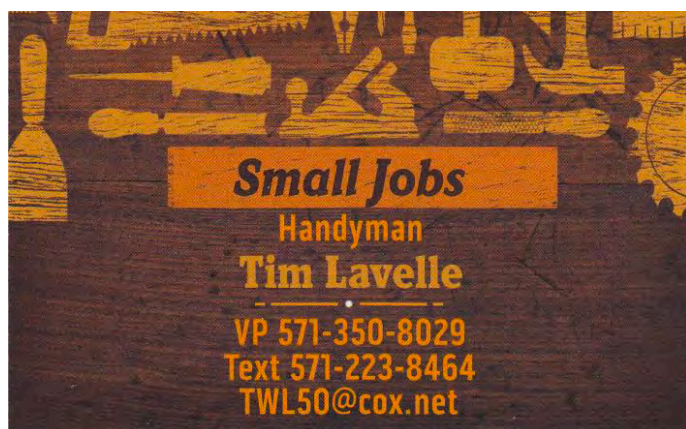


An Appreciation to a Carpenter

TAP Program at NVRC, a service of VDDHH

NVRC provides access to the Virginia Department for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing's Technology Assistance Program (TAP). Here is link for YouTube of Debbie Jones explaining the TAP Program:

As a contractor under the Virginia Department for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (VDDHH), NVRC is proud to assist qualified Virginia residents who are Deaf, Hard of Hearing, DeafBlind, or have speech disabilities in accessing free or low-cost telecommunication equipment and assistive technology through the Technology Assistance Program (TAP).

What is TAP? — TAP provides amplified telephones, captioned telephones, personal amplifiers, and doorbell signalers to help individuals stay connected and independent. The program operates on a Loan2Own basis: recipients can try out the equipment for 30 days and decide whether to keep, exchange, or return it.

Who is eligible? — Virginia residents who meet certain income requirements are eligible. Veterans with hearing or speech loss automatically qualify. Minors can apply with a parent or legal guardian co-signature.

How to apply? — To apply, complete a TAP application and provide supporting documentation, including:

- * Valid Photo ID
- * Proof of Virginia residency (e.g., driver's license, state ID, voter registration card, utility bill, or rental agreement)
- * Documentation of household income (e.g., W2, most recent bank statement, or income award statement like Social Security or retirement)
- * For honorably discharged Veterans, submit a copy of your discharge paperwork (DD-214 or NGD-22)

Our Deaf and Hard of Hearing Specialists are available for device demonstrations, referrals, and training on equipment usage.
